

2025 Mabuhay Medical/Dental Mission January 23-30, 2025, Agusan del Norte, Philippines

Mabuhay Foundation International (MFI) from Sacramento, California conducted a successful Medical/Dental Mission at the two poorest municipalities in Agusan del Norte: Carmen and RTR (Remedios T. Romualdez) from January 23-30, 2025. The Mabuhay team was composed of 84 medical doctors, physician assistants, nurses, medical technicians, dentists, dental assistants, and non-medical Mabuhay members and volunteers. Founded in 1995, MFI has been conducting medical/dental mission every two years except during the Covid 19 Pandemic.









Mosquito dunks contain Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis (Bti) bacteria that attack the gutlining of mosquito larvae. These dunks can kill mosquito larvae when placed in mosquito breeding grounds, especially in big bodies of water. Each dunk can cover 3 X 3 meters of surface water and effective for 1 month. A dunk can be broken into small bits for smaller area or smaller volume of water.




Each flash drive contains 14 files including presentations for seminars and workshops to BHW, and to elementary students; instructions for house-to-house campaign, instructions on building mosquito ovitraps; video on dengue infection, video on Aedes life cycle, etc.



* Because of all these help and collaborations, our medical and dental mission was conducted smoothly and successfully. We were able to provide 99 pediatric consultations and 315 adult medical consultations. We filled 437 medical prescriptions; measured blood sugar for 85 people; did tooth extractions for 82 adults and 52 children; given reading glasses to 336 adults; awarded 49 prescription glasses to grade school students; provided 150 food baskets to needy families; and given 188 toys to pediatric patients. We also conducted dengueprevention seminars and mosquito ovitrap workshops to 127 barangay health workers, barangay health volunteers and health personnel. We gave out 400 mosquito dunks to heads of municipal health offices for mosquito larval control.

Our next medical and dental mission will be in lloilo in early 2027 chaired by Ms. Bang Tubungan.
